2014-2015 FINANCIAL REPORT

What a hopeful year it's been for thousands of survivors of domestic violence in San Mateo County.

As the only agency solely dedicated to providing safety, support and healing to those experiencing abuse in an intimate relationship, skilled CORA counselors responded to more than 14,333 calls for domestic violence assistance last year.

In addition, specially trained mental health counselors provided increased support for child witnesses of domestic violence and our attorneys won some very tough cases against some formidable and far more well-resourced defendants. In order to provide more effective wrap-around services, we reorganized into two tracks—Crisis Intervention (Hotline, Emergency Response, and Shelter) and Family Support (Transitional Housing, Mental Health Services, and the Children's Program). A third-party evaluation of our services indicated that over 75% of our shelter clients gained increased self-sufficiency after their stay with us. Though our call volume continues to increase (24% over the previous year), we continue to lead the way in terms of who we serve and how we serve them.



