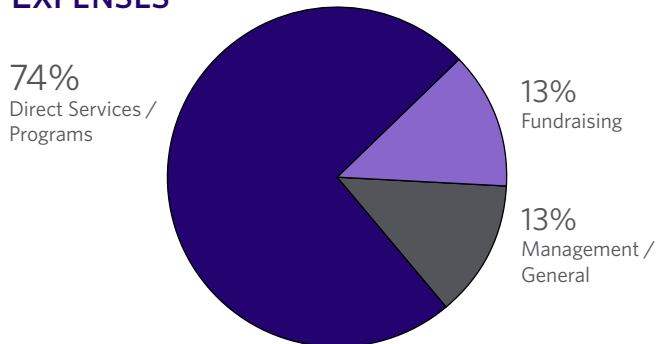

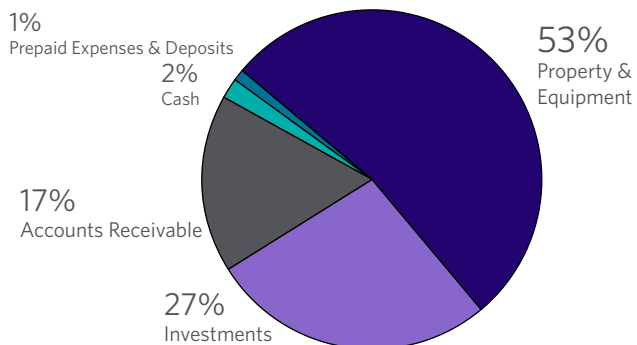

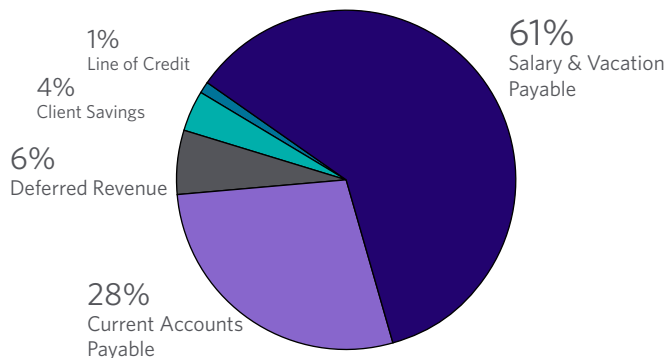

THE NEED PERSISTS

From shelter and hotline data analysis done in the Fall of 2017, it's estimated that annually at least **272 survivors of intimate partner abuse needing shelter** are turned away due to lack of funding. With an average stay of 41 days, this leaves CORA at a **shortage of 11,152 shelter bed nights per year.**

CORA is the only agency in San Mateo County solely dedicated to helping those affected by intimate partner abuse. From counseling, to emergency housing, to legal assistance, our services are designed to provide safety, support and healing.
